IN TANZANIA



Ten villages will own and oversee 49,000+ acres of elephant and lion habitat saved with funds from WLT's appeal, with partner TFCG boosting the local economy through training and loan associations.

IN HONDURAS



173 acres of quetzal habitat and a key water source for local people were saved in a WLT-backed project by partner AESMO where communities have a leading voice and co-own protected land.

IN PERU



With help from WLT supporters and partner NCP, 21,500+ acres were saved for Spectacled Bears, a critically endangered monkey species and more by the local people who own and run the reserve.

ACTION AT SCALE THROUGH APPEALS

SAVING TANZANIA'S COASTAL FORESTS, APRIL 2021

WLT's £360,000 appeal raised £400,000 within six weeks, making it possible to save some of the last 10% of East Africa's coastal forests. In an area where forest was being destroyed for roads and commercial plantations, the appeal funded the protection of 49,000+ acres, through a project where local villages will own – and benefit from – reserves with assistance from WLT partner TFCG.

SAVING BORNEO'S ORANGUTAN CORRIDORS, JUNE 2021

WLT's £150,000 appeal ended up raising £420,000, allowing partner HUTAN to protect much more habitat (five plots of rainforest) than initially planned (two plots). The campaign made it possible to expand a network of protected corridors in the Kinabatangan Floodplain of Malaysian Borneo, the home of orangutans, elephants, pangolins, hornbills, clouded leopards and many others.

GUARDIANS OF NIMLA HA', OCTOBER 2021

With help from the Big Match Fortnight of doubled donations, the £1,200,000 appeal – the most ambitious in WLT's history – raised £1,370,000+ and funded the tripling of partner FUNDAECO's Laguna Grande Reserve, saving thousands of acres of habitat home to 700+ species and protecting a chain of carbon-packed forests, wetlands, mangroves and more in the year of COP26.
